


Friday Finish: Chocolate Covered Cherries with Free Pattern

It was a perfect line as there is lots of reds and browns. Whether you use a fabric line or if you use your scrap bucket, this is a fun quilt to make.



We love quilts that have simply constructed blocks yet come together to make a great quilt.

I was the designer and Kelli the seamstress on this quilt. I was so excited as once she had the quilt together she said- "Hey mom, I have a suggestion for a quilting motif for this"...That was wonderful to hear as coming up with the design is always a challenge.

After I was done I wished I have put feathers in the outer border...next time.
