


In My Mail...

I've had so many things come to me via the mail and things that have been delivered to my house. I say this all the time, but it's so true. Thank you doesn't seem like nearly enough.


Over the last couple weeks here are a few things that have happened....

Mary Jo from Lacrosse gave me some goodies...Gluten free cook books for Kelli...




and fabric for me. See? All are fun ones that I'm sure to put to use once I get back to a sewing machine.


This came from Kathleen in CA. She wrote a cute note and said she was "sending kisses". How cute.

kiddos, thank you cards and other goodies too.




This came from an anonymous quilter in Indiana. A fun fairy door to put on a tree and woven fabric which I started collecting for finishing cross stitch pieces.
