I just finished listening to the book [The Breakdown: The 2017 Gripping Thriller from the Bestselling Author of Behind Closed Doors](#) by B.A. Paris. But since then, she's been forgetting every little thing: where she left the car, if she took her pills, the alarm code, why she ordered a pram when she doesn't have a baby.

The only thing she can't forget is that woman, the woman she might have saved, and the terrible nagging guilt.

Or the silent calls she's receiving, or the feeling that someone's watching her..."
