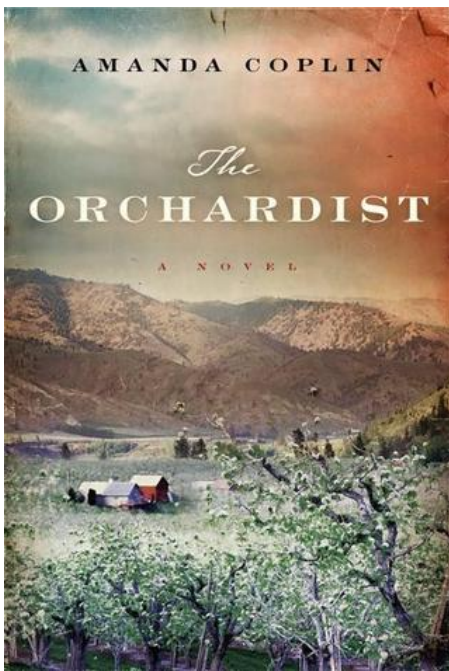


What I'm Reading: The Orchardist
